Canoeing on the Santa Fe River




On Saturday, June 17th, you can spend the day canoeing down the Santa Fe River with your ELI friends and family. We'll rent canoes and float for approximately three hours while enjoying Florida's sunshine and wildlife—the area is filled with birds, turtles, fish, and gorgeous plants, and the Santa Fe connects with several of

Florida's natural springs.

If you're interested, meet at Norman Hall Garage at 9 AM. We will likely return to Gainesville around 3 PM. The cost for renting a canoe all day is \$17 per person. You should wear your bathing suit and shoes that can get wet. Bring a picnic lunch, drinking water, suncreen, and a towel. Don't bring valuables that could get lost in the river. If you bring a camera, be sure to put it in a sealed plastic bag so it won't get wet.

If it is raining on Saturday, call 392-3354, ext. 230 after 7:30 AM to find out if the trip has been cancelled.

Although the water of the Santa Fe River runs as clear as the Ichetucknee, it's covered with a thin, reddish-brown layer—called *tannin*—that makes the water look tea-colored. This layer is made from leaves decomposing in the water.

- * The Student Government computer lab on the third floor of the Reitz Union offers free printing to all students; see sg.ufl.edu for more info.
- * Most photocopy shops along University Avenue have Internet-able computers where you can download your documents and print them out for pennies per page.
