If you are taking a vacation semester, you must speak with Daryl before May 8th. If you are a sponsored student, you must have a written approval from your sponsor.

If you cannot study in Summer C but want to return for Summer B or Fall C, please speak with Daryl.

If you do not check in on time, there will be a \$100 fee and you may not be permitted to enroll. Summer C classes begin on Monday, May 15th and all students must be in class by Wednesday, May 17th.
