### Notes from the Office

Fees: If you owe money to the infirmary, library, or the ELI for late tuition, you MUST pay by April 20th or you will not receive a commencement packet. Go to the ELI Office if you have questions.

Grades: To receive an ELI certificate, you must pass all of your classes. If you have questions about your grades, talk to your teachers or the ELI Office.

Going home between semesters: If you have an F-1 visa, page 2 of your I-20 must be signed in order to be allowed back into the country! Check it before you leave and go to the ELI main office if it is not. If you have a J visa, you must check with your ARO.

Vacation Semesters: You must speak with Daryl by May 8th if you plan to take a vacation semester during the summer.

If you cannot study in Summer C but want to return for Summer B or Fall C, please speak with Daryl.

Transferring: If you're transferring to another school or another ELI for Summer C, you'll need to show Daryl your letter of acceptance to the new school before May 16th so he can release your I-20 to that program.

Expiring I20? Talk to Daryl before it expires!

Expiring Financial Guarantee? Update it before May 17th.
