ufleli Iyad Bagari from Yemen is our #humansoftheeli this week and he told us his story! "After graduating top of my class in high school, it was really hard for me to find funding to study at a university. Most people would give up but I knew I had a great purpose in my life. After my aunt died of cancer, I knew I wanted to go into biomedical engineering because Yemen did not have the kind of advanced medical equipment needed to cure her. I knew, then, that I wanted to contribute to making my country better. After working hard on applications, I was the one student accepted out of 1,000 applicants for a scholarship to study in Jordan. It was very difficult to leave my country and my family for the first time, but I knew I had to do it. I studied in Jordan and worked very hard, graduating top of my class again. But when I got back to Yemen, I could not get a job. Instead of giving up, I knew I had to go on to get my master's degree. I was offered a scholarship to study in the United States, and here I am, improving my English before taking the next step towards my goal. I want to be someone who not only makes a difference in the healthcare system of my country, but I also want to be someone who represents my country well in international science. So many people just think Yemen is only about war and terrorism because that is what the media says. I hope to be someone who changes that view about Yemen and influences the world in a positive way.
