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My Life as an Undergrad: Part 4

The third unit of ENC1102 is natural sciences so we had to think of a small experiment or observation to do for 5 days and write a research proposal *before* we did the study. Research proposals are very important if you are going to write a dissertation for your PhD or if you want to get funding for a project. I was very excited because I have known since the 2nd day of class what I wanted to do. I was going to watch ants! Ants are very cool creatures.

For my proposal I had to have a research question, so I asked "Why do ants take fingernail clippings into the nests and what do they do with them?" The hardest part about writing the proposal was being very clear about the methods. How exactly was I going to test my research question? I wrote, "I will collect ants from my backyard and put them in an ant farm. Then I am going to put slivers of fingernails and watch what the ants do with the clippings. I think that the ants in my little farm will take them into their tunnels and feel them with their antennae." If you are
