Notes from the Office

Fees: If you owe money to the infirmary, library, or the ELI for late tuition, you MUST pay by August 1st or you will not receive a packet at Commencement. Go to the ELI Office if you have questions.

Grades: To receive an ELI certificate, you must pass all of your classes. If you have questions about your grades, talk to your teachers or the ELI Office.

Going home between semesters: If you have an F-1 visa, page 2 of your I-20 must be signed in order to be allowed back into the country! Check it before you leave and go to the ELI main office if it is not. If you have a J visa, you must check with your ARO.

Traveling: Remember to take all important documents (visa, passport, I-20) with you if you travel anywhere during the break! Even if you are planning to travel inside of the U.S., it is better to be prepared. If you need help during the break, call the ELI emergency cell.

CELT for Part-time Students: If you're not currently taking Listening Speaking or Grammar, your CELT will be Friday, July 28th in MAT 112. The Listening CELT will be from 12:45-1:20 p.m. and the Grammar CELT will be from 1:30-2:30 p.m. Don't be late!

Certificates: If you can't pick up your certificate at Commencement, come by Matherly 10 or Yon 314 by August 3rd to fill out a form so someone else can pick it up for you. We *cannot* give you the packet early. If you want to have it mailed or Fed-Exed, ask the office for the cost.

Letters from Victoria: If you received a letter about absences from Victoria and want to submit a petition, speak to her immediately in Yon 314. Bring your letter when you come to the office.

Subleases: If you want to find someone to take over your lease at the end of this semester, Victoria *might* be able to help.
