# **Texting While Walking: A Study**

#### Introduction

Nowadays, it has become very common to see people using their cell phones while they are getting from one place to another by walking, driving a car or even riding a bicycle. It has been demonstrated by different studies that texting while walking could cause serious consequences, from running into a light pole to getting hit by a car. According to a study from Ohio State University, more than 1,500 pedestrians went to emergency rooms as a result of texting while walking (as cited in Vicens 2014).

In "Texting while walking can be more dangerous than distracted driving", Lesley Adewunmi affirms that according to a study by the University at Buffalo, more injuries occur from distracted walking than distracted driving because pedestrians face three types of distractions: manual, because they are doing something else; visual, because they are trying to look at two things at the same time; and cognitive, because their mind is somewhere else. This article also expounds on some of the actions that countries and companies have already taken to address this issue in order to minimize the danger of texting while walking. As a way of illustration, Apple proposed to replace the background of the screen with a live video feed so people will be able to see what is in front of them while texting, and in London, they placed bumpers around the light posts to prevent pedestrians from running into them.

For this project, "texting" encompasses checking the cell phone or doing anything with the cell phone that requires looking down while walking and it is based specifically on the University of Florida's campus, which has many streets, intersections, light poles, stairs and parking lots, where an accident could easily happen. Texting becomes a problem whenever the person who is doing it starts doing another activity that requires their whole attention, such as driving or walking, because they are not completely focused on their surroundings so that the probabilities of having an accident increase. The activity that is studied in this project is walking. A study from State University of New York found that the people who use their cell phones while walking are 60 percent more likely to veer off course (as cited in Siegel 2014).

According to "For teens, texting while walking is also dangerous", by Alyssa Abkowitz, 40 percent of teens affirmed they have been hit or almost hit by motor vehicles while walking and the main reason is distraction from a mobile device. Moreover, 63 percent of these teens that said they had been hit or nearly hit also said it is normal to cross the street using their cell phones because there is nothing wrong with it. For this reason, Abkowitz recommends enforcing pedestrian safety laws so that teenagers would think it better before breaking the laws by crossing the street using their cell phone.

"Texting while walking: strategies for postural control and implications for safety" explains some of the possible causes why so many accidents are related to cell phone usage. For instance, as we try to make it easier to use the cell phone while walking, head movement corresponds to phone movement, and arm movement is equally related to thorax rotation, which reduces the postural control, making us more likely to stumble or veer off course by trying to maintain the cell phone in a visual field. The fact of the matter is that the strategies unconsciously used to maintain the phone in a steady position may compromise the posture control and impact on balance performance, which leads us to a greater risk of collisions or falls.

As far as the effects of this issue are concerned, in "Is it safe to walk while texting?" Marc Siegel describes several negative consequences that come with texting while walking. It mentions several studies related to distracted pedestrians, as a way of illustration, Bellevue Hospital's "Safer Streets" program determined that 4 percent of pedestrians were using their cell phones when struck by a car. In addition, different alternatives are shown in order to make texting while walking safer, such as voice activated software or apps with camera images that allow you to see your surroundings. Still, the safest advice is to put the cell phone down.

Besides, "Reports say texting while walking is becoming more dangerous" mentions this generation's need to stay connected all the time as one of the main causes why it has become so common to walk using an electronic device, and that need may explain why many people prefer to cross the street while texting instead of taking those few minutes to do it safely.

However, "RTS bus hits UF student texting in crosswalk near the Hub", by Kathryn Varn, tells the story of a UF student who was hit by a bus when she was crossing on a crosswalk while texting, but she did not assume any responsibilities for the crash so the advice that she gave to pedestrians was to "live to the fullest because you never know when you are going to get hit by a bus" instead of giving a better piece of advice related to paying more attention while crossing the street or not being distracted with your cell phone. Thus, it definitely depends on how serious this problem is taken and the first step to understand its gravity is to realize it is a current issue which is increasing day by day, because in cases as this UF student, she did not even take into consideration that if she had not been using her cell phone, she might have seen the bus and had been able to avoid the accident.

Texting while walking is a major problem, which is affecting a lot of people around the world. For example, in a community it does not only affect the ones who text while walking but also the other pedestrians, drivers, or anyone who crosses their way. Consequently, the UF campus is a place where everyone could be affected because there are several people on bicycles and in cars, and thousands of pedestrians.

The University of Florida had 49,555 students enrolled for the fall 2014 semester; whose average age is between 18 and 21 years old. It is one of the largest simple-campus universities in the United States and is home to 16 colleges where more than 100 undergraduate majors and 200 graduate degrees are offered.

RTS (Gainesville Regional Transit System) serves the UF campus with several routes and it also offers special services such as Gator Aider during football games, SNAP, and Later Gator at nights. Furthermore, UF has many different activities and lots of enjoyable areas that could be used not only to study but also for recreation. Hence, there are always many people around the campus so this problem might affect a great number of them.

Texting while walking can be considered a problem because there are many people who have already suffered its consequences. There are some universities, such as University of California, Berkeley (UCB), University of California, Los Angeles (UCLA), and California State University, Sacramento (CSUS), where the behavior of the pedestrians has already been studied in order to make it safer for their communities. Using the cell phone while walking has become a serious issue, which needs to be addressed before it gets worse and leads to more accidents.

All in all, this project could be significant to UF since it explains a recent topic, texting while walking, which might not have even been considered a problem. However, as it keeps becoming more common, it could also become more challenging to overcome it. Hence, being aware of the causes and consequences of this phenomenon is indispensable to develop different strategies to address this issue in the future.

#### Methodology

This project has two main purposes. First, to observe how many people usually text while walking and secondly, to determine how many people already know the danger of texting while walking. In order to find out whether it is necessary or not to inform the people about the consequences that, for example, texting while crossing the street can lead to, or, if they already know, to look for another possible solution to address this issue before it keeps aggravating.

The data for this project was collected through two different methods; both of them were collected on the UF campus. The first method used is observation; from January 30th until February 11th, three days per week (Monday, Wednesday, and Friday) from the Rawlings Hall bus stop to Matherly Hall. Also, the observation for each day occurred at the same time from 10:20 am to 10:40 am. This project only focuses on the people who were texting while walking and 401 individuals were observed.

In addition, on February 12th from 3:00 pm to 4:00 pm, a survey was given to 40 people, who were near the Plaza of the Americas, in order to discover if they are aware of the danger of texting while walking, if they do it as a habit, and the questions shown in Figure 3.

The people who were interviewed were randomly chosen. The places were chosen because many people frequent them and there are also several streets and crosswalks which allowed us to observe the pedestrians' behavior while crossing the street. Furthermore, neither the ones who were observed nor the ones who answered the survey were chosen for specific reasons. Even so, the ones who answered the survey were asked to indicate their nationality, their age, and their gender. After having both observation and survey information, it was separated by different parameters such as gender and nationalities, which eased the way to analyze it and made the results clearer to understand.

# Results and Discussion

#### <u>Observation</u>

Figure 1 indicates the difference between women and men who were observed from January 30th to February 11th. It is clear that women are more likely to text while walking than men. Even though it is clear that more women were observed texting, it does not affirm that women are more likely to text while walking than men because there could have been more women on that route.

Figure 2 presents the same information, separating men and women, but also provides the number of people who were observed each day, which allows us to consider external factors that may have influenced the numbers obtained. For instance, February 6th was a really cold day and it was raining at the time of the observation; also, on February 9th it was very cold, and so those are the two days when a significant decrease of people texting can be observed. Compared to these two days, the behavior observed the rest of the time did not change meaningfully. Nonetheless, a factor that totally stopped people from texting while walking was not found.

Regarding the differences found in the behavior of the people because of the weather, one conclusion we can draw is that people are significantly less likely to use their cell phone while walking when it is raining or when it is cold, just to get to their destination in a shorter time or to stay dry.

Even though the weather is a significant factor, it leads us to think that when people stop texting, it is because of the reasons that were mentioned before, but not because they are conscious of the dangers of texting while walking

#### Survey

Although we asked for age and nationality on the survey, we did not analyze the correlation between that and the responses because we focused the survey on the habit of using the cell phone. However, the ages of the interviewees are between 18 and 56 years old, and there are 11 different nationalities.

Figure 3 presents four of the questions that were asked in the survey, which gives us information about the interviewees' habits and knowledge about the risk of texting while walking. [Omitted for this publication]

It was demonstrated that 75% of the people who answered the survey usually text while walking, 65% consider it dangerous, 82.5% would not cross the street while texting and 65% have already run or nearly run into something because they were distracted while texting. This information indicates that the majority of the people surveyed text and walk as a habit, but also a great number of them knows about its risk. Although only 17.5% of the people admitted they would cross the street while texting, comparing it to the observation, it seems like a bigger amount of people would do it. This might mean that it is not important for them to pay attention to the road even when crossing the street, or it is important but not as important as using their cell phone.

More than half of the people said they have run or nearly run into something because they were texting. This seems to be because their cell phone requires most of their attention so they walk being distracted by their devices.

The last question is about what people think. Even though there were different responses, the largest number of people think that more than 1,000 emergencies were related to cell phone usage in America last year, which is correct. This summarizes that most of the people are aware of the risk that texting while walking represents but they still do it frequently.

One last conclusion we can draw comparing the information obtained in both the observation and the survey, is that a great amount of people know about the danger of texting while walking and also about the consequences that it can lead to, but they will keep doing it even if they have already run or nearly run into something. Nonetheless, there are some factors that do influence their behavior, such as the bad weather, but with the exception of that factor; they will not stop from texting while walking.

#### Conclusion

According to Chad Holway, a police officer from University of Florida Police Department, texting while walking is not considered an issue that affects the society around the UF campus. Since using the cell phone while crossing the street is not against the law, it is not a primordial concern for him. In his opinion, it is not necessary to create a law against texting while walking. Nevertheless, he mentioned that it is always recommendable to encourage pedestrians to pay attention to the road while crossing the street, which encompasses putting their cell phones down. This seems to be the main reason why nothing has been done in UF to prevent people from texting while walking; since it is not considered a problem, it might not concern the authorities. However, the University of Florida has already been affected by this issue; as it was mentioned in this project, a UF student was hit by a bus while she was crossing the street being distracted by her cell phone. Nevertheless, Mr. Holway did not know about this accident.

Considering the great number of people who were observed texting while walking on campus, it could be inferred that sooner or later this phenomenon may affect the society around campus, because there are thousands of pedestrians who have to cross many streets, where accidents could easily happen if they are distracted with their cell phone. Even though UF has not taken any actions taken to address this issue, there are some places and companies around the world that have already started to tackle it. For instance, some sidewalks in China have been divided between pedestrians who are using their cell phone and the ones who are not, in London they placed bumpers around the light posts so pedestrians would not run into them, and Apple proposed to replace the background of the screen with a live video feed so people will be able to see what is in front of them while texting.

Nonetheless, the solutions that have been taken are not directed to the major problem; instead of working on changing pedestrians' behavior, the actions taken are directed to protect them while they keep using their cell phone, which is the real issue. Diverse alternatives could be considered, such as making public campaigns to create awareness about this issue, share information in newspapers or websites to generate interest about the consequences of distracted walking, produce commercials with interesting facts about texting while walking, offer conferences or presentations to raise awareness about this problem, and place warning signs near crosswalks to remind pedestrians to not use their cell phone, at the very least, while crossing the street.

Finally, it mostly depends on how serious this problem is taken so creating awareness in the society would definitely be a well-chosen strategy to reverse this trend. In addition, the University of Florida campus is a place where the mentioned alternatives could be developed and because of the vast number of people who frequent its areas, it seems to be a good place to implement this plan.

When the dumplings are frying, use a wooden spoon to move it around and let it cook evenly. Finally, when the dumplings are light

brown, remove them from the oil and place them on kitchen paper. Pour your favorite syrup on top. I use date syrup. If your dumplings don't turn out round shaped, don't be discouraged; keep on trying and you'll eventually have round ones.

# **Improving Safety on Campus**

#### 1. Introduction

Crimes are committed in new and various locations every day in the United States, as well in colleges across the country. One in five undergraduate women nationwide will be the victims of a sex crime, but 40 percent of colleges in national sample have not conducted appropriate investigation (McCaskill, 2014) possibly because women students aged between 18 and 24 hesitate to report their attack fearing a reprisal (Lepri and Leonor, 2015). Florida universities have common interests with these problems in other colleges in the US by showing a shameful record of failure in protecting students. The statistics from the Annual Security and Safety Report 2014 by UFPD clearly show that thousands of crimes, such as robbery, rape, theft, burglary, domestic violence and dating violence, take place on campuses daily.

In order to solve these undesirable circumstances, there have been vigorous arguments whether students need to be allowed to carry concealed deadly weapons on a college campus in order to protect themselves from crimes. Meanwhile, federal and state governments and colleges have made utmost efforts to protect their vulnerable students from crimes, as The Violence against Women Act, reauthorized and signed in 2013 by President Obama. However, new efficient solutions to prevent on campus crimes need to be put into practice as a continuation of security measures. The University of Florida (UF) is located in Gainesville, a town in north central Florida. The UF is one of the five largest universities in the nation with over 50,000 students, and more than 4,000 faculty members. The student body includes 6,000 international students from more than 130 countries around the world. The ratio of women to men is 54/46, and 32 percent of students are graduate and professional students as of 2014 (University of Florida, 2015a).

Minority students constitute nearly 30 percent of the student body, with African American, Hispanics, Native American, and Asian American or Pacific Islanders. UF is divided into 16 colleges and more than 150 research, service and education centers, bureaus and institutes, offering more than 100 undergraduate majors and 200 graduate degrees. These figures have allowed for UF to be named one of the most comprehensive and academically diverse universities in the nation (University of Florida, 2015b).

In the University of Florida the most common crimes reported over the years have been rapes, burglaries, and thefts. UFPD defines rapes as: "the carnal knowledge of a person, forcibly and/or against the person's will; or not forcibly or against the person's will where the victim is incapable of giving consent because of his/her temporary permanent mental or physical incapacity (or because of his/her youth)".

Burglary is defined by UFPD as: "the unlawful entry into a building or other structure with the intent to commit a felony. Theft is the generic term for all crimes in which a person intentionally and fraudulently takes personal property of another without permission or consent" (UFPD, official website, 2014).

Crime news is common in the media. We can observe a series of reports that show us those thefts, burglaries, robberies and sexual assaults are still happening on the UF campus over the years. In 2009 at UF, four cell phones thefts were reported at the Southwest Recreation Center, according to reports filed with the University Police Department one of the cases occurred inside the building (Stewart, 2009). According to Thomas Stewart, in "Thieves target cell phones at campus gym", from The Independent Florida Alligator, the incidents occurred between Sunday and Tuesday, one of the phones was tucked in a shoe, another one was inside a backpack, and the others were laying on the ground. In 2010, a case of someone robbing a female UF student at gunpoint was reported on campus near the Broward tennis courts at night, just after getting out of the RTS bus. The security camera caught the suspect who is considered black male. The crime occurred around 11:30 p.m., the criminal pointed a semi-automatic handgun at her stomach, and the victim gave the suspect a black bag, an iPod and a cell phone (Flechas, 2010a).

A sexual battery case at a fraternity house was reported in 2010, around 2 a.m. at Nine Fraternity Row. The victim was a female and not a UF student; in this case the suspect was a male UF student (Flechas, 2010b). In addition, one-year suspension from its national organization was received by Tau Epsilon Phi Fraternity in November 2008, after 36 pledges were found kneeling shirtless on the basement floor (Stewart, 2008).

According to University of Florida Police Department, in Annual Security and Safety Report 2013, burglary, aggravated assault, the motor vehicle theft, forcible sex offenses, and robbery cases were common crimes happened inside UF campus, where the UFPD exercise their jurisdiction. Importantly, this annual report showed that 24 forcible sex offense cases on campus buildings or property, while other 10 cases happened at noncampus building or property between 2010 and 2012. The University Police Department, in their website, also shows that in the last few years the campus security has increased by officers in bicycles, UFPD K-9 team, Health Science Center Police Office, Motorcycle units, among other services.

Given those conditions of on campus crimes at the University of Florida, it has been important and critical challenge for university administration, security authorities, and even students and staffs to improve on-campus safety issues, and thus protect students and staff and their assets from crimes. In this regard this project attempts to understand the current patterns and trends of on campus crimes in the University of Florida. In addition, we explore the current programs and strategies to prevent on-campus crimes, and find potential implications to improve on-campus security issues. Through these analyses, this study aims to suggest effective and efficient solutions that can solve crime issues in the University of Florida.

#### 2. Methodology

In addressing on-campus crime issues in the University of Florida, this project uses three methods: 1) analysis of past crime reports and statistical data, 2) review of current crime prevention programs and strategies, and 3) a field survey. First of all, we analyzed past crime statistics that have been reported in various sources. This project presents various on-campus crime data in depth, and compares them to identify problems.

Secondly, we review the detailed programs and strategies that have been made by the University administration, police department, and other stakeholders in the University of Florida, such as officers in bicycles, UFPD K-9 team, Health Science Center Police Office, motorcycle units, among other services. In order to increase the understanding of the university's efforts to build safer campus environments, we summarize presentations made by a university safety program officer and a university police officer.

Third, we present how a small sample of students, faculties, and staff on campus think about the current campus security system, and how they think security problems can be improved. For that, we conducted a survey with students, faculties, and staff on the campus focusing on their understanding of crime cases on campus, crime prevention efforts made by security authorities and police department, and suggestions to improve campus security system.

#### 3. Discussion

#### 3.1. Crime Reports and Past Statistics

The Violence Against Women Act, reauthorized and signed in 2013 by President Barack Obama, requires cases of sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence, and stalking that are reported to campus or security and occurs within campus grounds to be reported in the statistics. Therefore, crime statistics are much more transparent than ever before. However, it is difficult to compile various numbers of crimes committed on college campuses because the data reported to campus security authorities and/or police agencies vary depending on sources (Students for Concealed Carry, 2009). Some statistics are, for example, different from police authorities because they are provided by non-police authorities, such as administrative authorities and denounces anonymous. Thus this project attempts to present as many available crime statistics as possible to present important characteristics of on-campus crime at the University of Florida. Some important figures include:

• The crime data reported to the U.S. Department of Education (2011 and 2014) showed that on-campus criminal offenses recorded its highest at 76 cases in 2009 and another peak at 67 cases in 2012. Among crime types, burglary has occupied the most common on-campus crime position over the period from 2008 to 2013, but it has been decreased from 86 percent in 2008 to 36.7 percent in 2013.

• Motor vehicle thefts were the second most common crime on the University of Florida campus over the same period. It recorded the peak at 38.2 percent in 2008, and decreased to 16.4 percent in 2012. However, its share in total on campus offenses increased to 36.7 percent in 2013.

• In addition, forcible sex offenses and aggravated assaults have occupied the third and fourth most common crime positions over the same period. It should be seriously noted that on-campus forcible sex offenses have shown rapid increases from 1 case in 2008 to 14 cases in 2013, while burglary recorded the lowest level in 2013 by decreasing over the past six year. In addition, on-campus motor vehicle thefts have been chronic factor that threaten on-campus safety.

• Interestingly, the share of criminal offenses that occurred oncampus student housing facilities has increased from 2009 to 2013. In particular, the data showed the highest record of 27 cases in 2013, and forcible sex offenses, among crimes, increased significantly between 2010 and 2013.

• Among on-campus offenses, rapid increases in forcible sex offenses on campus student housing should be considered seriously by the university administration and security authorities. In addition, programs and strategies are needed to prevent burglaries in the University of Florida campus.

• Table 1 shows on campus and the share of on-campus student housing offenses reported to the US Department of Education by type of crime.

• There are other reports that have presented crime statistics in the University of Florida campus. In 2013, the University of Florida reported high number of crimes such as 15 cases of rape, 13 cases of stalking, 2 cases of dating violence, 2 cases of forcible foundling, and 20 cases of domestic violence. In 2012, UF reported 8 cases of rape and 16 cases of forcible foundling, but domestic violence, dating violence, and stalking was not included (Head, 2014).

• The University of Florida saw high numbers of on campus larceny in 2012, of which 28 cases were on-campus

burglaries. With these, among other crimes, 88 arrests were made at UF in 2012 (James, 2014).

• The 2014 Annual Security and Fire Safety Report reported a total of 7 crimes (2 aggravated assaults, 1 burglary, and 4 domestic violence) in 2013, which increased by 5 cases in 2012. In addition, 3 people arrested for liquor law violations, and 7 people were arrested for drug violations (UF Health Science Center, 2014).

3.2. Crime Prevention Programs and Strategies

In order to promote a healthy and safe environment for all students and staffs, UF offers many educational programs and resources open to the public including presentations, information, and literature promoting responsible decision-making and concerning the use of alcohol and drugs. For example, Gatorwell offers confidential screening assessments for alcohol and drug use and referrals to campus and community agencies for recovery assistant (UF Police Department, 2014).

According to Rita Lawrence and Anna L. Armitage, in their presentation: "An Overview of Interpersonal Violence", offered by STRIVE & GatorWell Health Promotion Services, women between 16 and 24 years of age experience the highest rates of sexual assaults, and alcohol is the number one cause of raping cases. They explain that to avoid acts of sexual violence the person could involve law enforcement, tell others about their cases, notice more suspicious acts around them, and anticipate and interpret the event as a problem. In this presentation, they emphasized that the behavior of the victims is not the principal cause of sexual violence, but the violence of the aggressor.

Also the University of Florida Police Department Community Services Division offers educational programs, presentations, and literature promoting responsible decision-making and providing education on the legal consequences of alcohol and drug use (UF Police Department, 2014). In the presentation: "Safety Program, Services and Tips for Staying Safe at the University of Florida", offered by the University of Florida Police Department, police officer Chad Holway explained that the UF campus has 3 bicycles officers, 4 officers in motorcycles, 4 K-9 units, and that all campus comprises a total of 18 police officers to serve the whole UF campus at any given time.

Among other services offered by UFPD there are emergency blue phones around campus, RAD (self-defense) program for women, programs to walk safe (SNAP) that comprises 15 people on the crew, property registrations, Tap Shield App (GPS panic button), voluntary inspections programs, and personal and property security presentations, like this one. Officer Chad Holway thinks that all these services are more than enough to keep campus in safety, and that registering personal properties is the best way to avoid theft and burglaries, as well the Tap Shields Apps, that could be used in emergency cases and to locate cell phones.

Other programs include free bicycle registration to prevent bicycle from theft, Operation Identification (OP-ID) which promotes identification of personal properties, "Gator Watch Crime programs that introduce concepts of personal responsibility and how an individual can positively affect crime", Stall Stories which publish stories about personal safety, crime prevention, and special security issues, and the "Voluntary Inspection Program (V.I.P.) which encourages apartment complexes and rental properties to practice safety standards" (UF Police Department, 2014).

#### 3.3. Surveys

As presented above, crime statistics have shown that the UF campus is not free from crimes, thus the UF administration, police department, and other security authorities have implemented various efforts to protect students and staffs from on-campus crimes. However, individuals' awareness of potential threat and understand of programs would be the most important factor that can make those policy efforts to be successful. In this consideration, this project conducted a survey to identify how individuals think about on-campus safety issues.

A survey was made with 21 participants including students, professors, and staff on the Plaza of the Americas, UF campus. The place was chosen because it is a square high movement of persons. The following questions were made to them: "1) Do you feel safe on campus? 2) Have you ever experienced any crime on campus? What type of crime? 3) Do you know anybody who has experienced crimes on campus? What type of crime? 4) What could be done to improve security on campus?" The results are as follows:

As the Figure 2 shows, the survey shows that majority of the interviewed people feel safe on campus, while some of them think campus is not a completely safe place. 13 people out of the 21 people interviewed answered that they feel safe on campus. Five participants responded that they feel safe just during the day, while 2 people said that they are in the middle. In other words, they don't feel campus as dangerous place, but they also don't completely feel safe. Only one person said that campus is not a safe place.

The result of second question is presented in Figure 3 below. The majority of the interviewed people, 18 of the 21 of them, responded that they have not been exposed to any kind of crime cases. Only 3 people answered that they were victims of crimes on campus. Two out of three experienced thefts or burglaries, while one of them experienced stalking. Figure 3 below presents responses to the second question in our survey.

The next question asked was whether they know anyone who experienced on campus crimes. Large portion of the interviewed people, 13 out of 21 interviewed people, responded that they have no one who encountered on campus offender. Meanwhile eight answered "Yes" meaning that they know someone who was a victim of a crime inside campus, of which 7 experienced thefts or burglaries. Other 2 responded they know sexual harassment victims, and one interviewed person knows someone who is a stalking victim. Figure 4 illustrates the survey results of question 3.

Our final survey question aimed to find out how people think on campus security and safety should be improved. The results obtained from the final question are described in Figure 5. The results show that 8 out of the 21 interviewed people want to have more lights at night, while 5 people asked for more police officers and SANPs. Other 3 suggested more blue emergency phones, and just 2 interviewed people asked for surveillance cameras. Figure 5. Responses to: "WHAT COULD BE DONE TO IMPROVE SECURITY ON CAMPUS?"



The on-campus crime statistics revealed that large number of crimes occurred every year inside of the University of Florida campus. However, the surveys revealed that the majority of interviewed people may not aware of potential safety threats on campus. This finding suggests that the statistics and reports about crimes are not coming to the attention of people or that they feel that authorities are doing enough to prevent crime.

Meanwhile, a significant number of people in the survey do not feel safe on campus or feel an imminent danger to all who attend the UF. The number of people who presented concerns on campus safety issues could not be ignored, and thus their suggestions for security improvements should be carefully observed by UF authorities. The people in the survey expressed that the darkness of the campus at night and the low number of Emergency Blue Phones around campus are the most problems.

#### 4. Conclusion

Since university campus safety is a real concern for the students, staff, and employees, it has been an important challenge for university administration, security authorities, and individuals to sustain safe on-campus environments. Given these conditions, this project aimed to find effective and efficient solutions to improve on-campus safety problems. For that reason, this project attempted to understand the patterns and trends of on campus crimes at the University of Florida. This project also explored current programs and strategies to prevent on-campus crimes, and find implications to improve campus safety problems.

In order to address on-campus crime issues in the University of Florida, this project adopted three methods: 1) analyze past crime reports and statistical data, 2) review current crime prevention programs and strategies, and 3) field survey of students and staffs. In order to increase the understanding of university's efforts to build safer campus environments, this project summarized presentations made by university safety program officer and university police officer.

Reports about crime news are often published in local medias; the University of Florida Police Department publishes an annual report every year with statistics and number of crimes committed, and a significant number of interviewed people on campus report that they have already been victim of a crime or they have already known anyone else who had this experience.

The crime statistics of the University of Florida show that there are chronic crime issues in campus. Among crimes, burglary occupied the largest portion, but its shares in total offenses have decreased over the past six years, from 86 percent in 2008 to 36.7 percent in 2013. In addition to burglary, motor vehicle thefts and forcible sex offenses are common crimes in the University of Florida. In particular, the increase in forcible sex offenses is serious problems for UF authorities to provide safe campus environments. The statistics in recent five years showed that forcible sex offenses have increased from 1 case in 2008 to 14 cases in 2013. Therefore, more effective programs should be implemented to prevent sex offenses in the university campus. For example, it may be essential for victims to easily get help of law enforcement or other specialists who can deal with sex offense victims. It should be noted and improved that law enforcement officials at 30 percent of institutions in the national survey receive no training on how to respond to reports of sexual violence. More importantly, over 70 percent of institutions do not have protocols regarding how the institution and local law enforcement should work together to resolve sexual offense cases (McCaskill, 2014).

UFPD shows that they have various services to keep safety on campus, and say that they believe that they are doing more than enough to prevent crimes in the university. However, part of the UF students, staff, and employees who were interviewed respond that safety on campus could be improved. As they have expressed they feel that some locals of campus became real dark at night, what could facilitate a crime act, once the criminal can suppose that he doesn't have "an eye on him". Also, part of the interviewed people suggested for more Emergency Blue Phones around the campus. This response shows that the numbers of emergency phones are not enough to keep such a big campus as the University safe.

Maintaining a safe environment on campus is a big deal for authorities, and thus the idea that they have already been doing more than enough to prevent crimes does not correspond to reality. In addition, since types of crimes and the forms of action of the criminals are constantly changing, it is necessary for security authorities to always keep improving security services for the campus. Installing more lights and more Emergency Blue Phones around the UF campus could be a good start rather than loud but ineffective programs.
