How to Apologize

For many people the word apology simply means "I'm sorry." However, the art of apology is not as simple as saying, "I'm sorry." It needed to be polished and refined to make it a heartfelt apology; that is, it needs to start by showing reconsideration and end by offering restitution. Therefore, the question here is what are the things that make an apology meaningful?

Obviously, there are many ways to apologize for hurting, insulting, failing or injuring others. Nevertheless, the ideal approach for proper apology depends on five important criteria. First, the injured party needs to recognize that the offender understands what exactly he or she did wrong by showing recognition. That is, the offender has to recognize his or her fault by accepting full responsibility for the injury by saying, for example, "I'm ashamed that I hurt you" or "It is my fault, I admit it" or simply "I was wrong." However, you do not want to justify too much otherwise it will look like fault excuses and the victim may not accept the apology from its first part.

For instance, if you are trying to apologize for ruining someone's jacket that you borrowed, you cannot say, "I am sorry if I made you upset, but it is not really my fault because someone has just painted the chair that I sat on and then it started raining." These all are trivial excuses that make the apology look very counterfeit. Another thing to pay attention to is the use of the italicized words above "if" and "but," as they are considered words that destroy the perfect apology. The addition of these simple and small words can contradict everything that came before it, as it makes the apology conditional and turns the apology back onto the recipient. Saying "but" in the example above is like saying, "although there are many reasons for running your jacket, they were all out of my control and that the world most likely caused it." Thus, someone should be careful where to place these little words.

Second of all, the offender has to accept full responsibility for the injury and should identify his or her role in the situation. That is, the receiver of the apology has to hear that the offender is taking complete responsibility for his or her actions and any harm that was caused. Saying "It is my entire fault" or "I accept the full responsibility for what I've done," is a very important element for the honest apology to be complete

because it gives the apology a sense of sincerity and shows that the offender is really taking blame for injuring the other party. Although accepting the full responsibility could be a hard thing to do sometimes, accepting full responsibility when offering an apology is a great approach that shows integrity, modesty and a willingness to accept liability after all.

Offering remorse or true regret is the third part for building the perfect apology. This basically means "I'm sorry," a simple and a straightforward sentence that has the two magic words. As easy as it should be to say these two magic words, it is sometimes tempting and attractive for many of us to use more than those two simple words. Hiding behind excuses can easily destroy the perfect apology. Therefore, one should atone for the wrong thing that occurred by only holding to the words that carry the true meaning of apology within such as, "I'm sorry or I apologize."

Giving assurances that the transgression will not happen again is a good way to end the apology. That is, offering restitution and compensation for the offense by saying, "What can I do for you?" or "How can I make it up to you." This can be beneficial to both the offender and the receiver of the apology. The offender can be relieved of any remaining guilt because at this point he or she has met all the apology requirements. For the receiver, emotional healing can take place following the apology, as he or she can feel much better about forgiving the offender. The offender can make the apology look even better by making a promise about the future that asserts no mistakes will ever be repeated again. For example, someone could say something like, "I promise I will never wear your jacket without your permission again." Moreover, the offender can perform a kind or thoughtful gesture to make it up to the person, as it will help to emphasize our sincerity and make the injured party feel better. For example, taking him or her out to a nice dinner or a movie is a proper choice. Keeping with the previous example, you can continue to make a sincere apology by adding, "I'm sorry I ruined your jacket; I accept the full responsibility for what I've done. I promise I will never wear your jacket. Please let me pay for the dry cleaning."

One last thing to mention about apology is the timing frame. Timing is important when apologizing because sometimes delays can make the original issue complex and make the injured party less open for forgiveness. On the other hand, instant apologies can be risky sometimes as some people need time to come down from the situation that made them get angry. Therefore, giving the injured party you want to apologize to some space and time before approaching him or her with your apology can be helpful and appreciated. However, be sure not to wait three weeks to apologize. A day or two may be the best, depending on the degree of injury. This will give each side time to think about what was done or said, and to gain some insight and perspective into the situation and their motivations.

To conclude, a sincere apology is a great tool for healing damaged relationships. It can be a powerful device for a person who has been wronged and a healing one for an injured party. Apologies that are insincere and full of excuses can do more harm than good. One cannot control how the apology will be accepted, but if one did the best to make it sincere the odds are pretty high that it will be accepted and that

the injured one will feel much better as a result of the sincere apology.

Reflections of a Young Venezuelan

Venezuela is a country known by its pretty beaches, natural resources such as petroleum, and unique beauties. However, sometimes these benefits of a country cover problems that in many cases we do not like to talk about. One particular issue is taking control of everything in Venezuela – the

payment for services of materials which the recipient is not due, under law, or when elected representatives make decisions that are influenced by vested interest rather than the interest of the country's political ideologies – corruption. Corruption has affected the Venezuelan society for a long time, and until today, it remains as one of the most concerning problems of the country. But, what is corruption in Venezuela? And in what ways has corruption affected its citizens?

Description of the Problem

According to The Transparency International (2011), Venezuela has been evaluated as one of the most corrupted countries in the world. In many opportunities, previous Venezuelan presidents have called in many of the members from the Interior Ministry to cope with the problem, demanding more effort in the fight against corruption and impunity, and to affirm the need to transform police forces as well as justice corps. However, no one has been able to address this problem completely.

Throughout history, accusations have emerged against many politicians in the country; using friends to fill authority positions as opposed to going through the proper procedures, politicians have often been criticized of cronyism. In addition, corrupted political officials misuse their political authority to advance in personal economic interests. Unfortunately, the persons with power to act against it are not doing much to solve the problem. Not only have the judicial power and police forces been taken by the problem, institution like the National Assembly turn a blind eye to the problem as well. Therefore, corrupt officials have not had much control.

Where exactly does all of this corruption come from? Some people say that when a country becomes wealthy, the system begins to be corrupted by the large sums of money circulating in the government – as was the case with Venezuela when natural resources such as gold and petroleum were discovered. The combination of the lack of knowledge in financial management and an unjust political leader driven by greed and selfishness challenged the moral of many officials. Gradually, large financial transactions began to be "pinched" by certain underpaid public officials. In turn, the judges, congress, and police, sometimes also with low salaries, are bribed to look in the other direction while these "pinches" were made. Consequently, anyone who might be in charge of justice either turned a blind eye or they were busy participating in the problem themselves. Ultimately, this led to corruption in the society, which now brings us to the current deadlock.

People nowadays would do anything to save themselves. As a result, impunity has become more common in the country. In many areas, only "the law of the fittest" works. This issue of bribery and fraud is growing. For instance, if you are traveling by car, the police could ask you for money if they notice anything wrong with your car or if you have anything missing information in your documents. If you want to find a document quickly, you only have to talk with the appropriate persons, give them enough money, and they will solve your problems for you – with a price.

Personal Opinion on the Issue

Corruption in Venezuela has grown out of hand. Many of us constantly wonder, day and night, election after election, decade after decade, who is to blame? When will it be solved? Or even, we doubt if there is even a solution to corruption. However, while we sit and wonder, we failed to realize that the problem may be within ourselves.

Although it is difficult to accept, corruption has become a serious problem because of the tremendous political and social unwillingness within the people, which have interfered with the fight against corruption. If we check the facts, we will find that this belief of "nothing can be done" is untrue. These two policies changed China significantly and positively. However, these two policies still result in some problems. First, as the speed of the population slowed, the rate of aging is accelerating. Tania Branigan said, "Life expectancy has soared in China, while fertility has plummeted due to strict birth control policies. In 2009 there were 167 million over-60s, about an eighth of the population. By 2050 there will be 480 million, while the number of young people will have fallen." Second, the labor pool in the future will shrink fast. Stephen Green also said," The overall story is clear? Thanks to the decline in births 20 years ago, China's labor pool will likely stop expanding in size very soon". Third, the one child policy changed the culture and value. Recent research has shown that it is good for children to know that they were adopted since their very early childhood. Moreover, parents who tell their children that they are adopted when they are very young allow the children to get the information in a correct and painless way; consequently, those children will have a better approach to their situation. A child who knows that he or she is adopted since his or her early childhood is more likely to accept the fact in a natural and positive way.

Another reason that supports that small children must know that they are adopted is that parents must have control of the way their adopted children will know that they were adopted. Parents can control when to inform their child, but cannot control the fact that the children can get the information from another person. For example, a classmate, at school, could tell a child that he or she is adopted. In a case like this, it is pretty sure that the child will be confused and stressed, putting him or her into an overwhelming and out of control situation. It means that a specific account of the offence should be given to insure that the offender and the offended are on the same page. Doing this confirms the feelings of the offended because the offender itself is reviewing what happened. Being accurate about this aspect is very important since you want your apology to be as sincere as possible and part of that sincerity relies on focusing only on the offense. It means apologize for what has been done, not for the reasons or causes of your mistake.

After giving the detailed account, you want to let the offended know that you realize the damage or hurt that your offense has caused. It permits that the offended feels that you are aware of the situation and fully understand why that person is offended. Acknowledging the situation will allow the offender to respond to it in a proper way according to the magnitude of the problem caused.

Once you have given a detailed account of the situation and realized the problem caused, it is time to take actions for what you have done. It means to take responsibility for your acts. It is important to not offer excuses for what you did. It gives the sense that you are not really asking for an apology but your intention is to justify your acts. Remember that in this case it is not about you but about the other person so instead of giving reasons for what you did, let them now that you realize that you are responsible for the situation.

Now comes the moment of truth. It is time to show repentance. Let the very well known "I am sorry" or "I apologize" roll. Even though you can use several words to show repentance you should stick to those two basic sentences. This is the main purpose of an apology: to let the other know that you are sorry. Nevertheless, saying you are sorry may not be enough. You should let the offended know that you will not do it again because there is no real repentance if you offend someone repeatedly,; it would become a practice then.

Having done all of this it is now time to ask for forgiveness. Offering some kind of action to repair your damage is beneficial because it shows to the offended your commitment to your apology. Besides that, a good reward may make the offended forgive more easily.

Doing all that lets the offended feel that he is in control of the situation. You as the offender put all the cards on the table and there is not much of what you can do now, just expect denial or acceptance of your apology.

Summing up, even though there is not a perfect recipe for an apology since it depends on several aspects like the magnitude of the offense, the consequences of it or the offender itself, there are some elements that should be included in every valid apology. It will help you deal with your daily life and have a better relationship with your surrounding world.

What Makes a Perfect Apology?

We people make mistakes because we are not perfect. We often have an argument and a quarrel among our friends, family, and colleagues and it is never easy to apologize properly. Making an apology seems not to be a big deal; however, it is a very dangerous and complicated matter to engrave in our minds. Moreover, sometimes people are afraid of apologizing because there are several wrong common beliefs.

For example, people think that when a higher officer apologizes to a member of the staff, the person would lose their leadership. In addition, let's assume that two people are involved in an accident and when a person says, "I am sorry" first for the accident, the other person would institute a lawsuit and the person would lose a lot of money by admitting the fault. For these reasons, an apology is not straightforward. However, when we make a mistake and commit a fault, the most effective and powerful method to right the situation is an apology. It does not mean that a real apology is to say "I am sorry." The typical statements, such as "I said I am sorry", "I am sorry, is everything okay now?", "Ah! Sorry," are used only for people who do not know what an apology is. We need to know the appropriate way to make a sincere apology. In fact, it should always have these steps: showing recognition, accepting responsibility, offering remorse, offering restitution, and promising.

First, recognition of one's faults as a first step makes a sincere apology easier. Do not say, "I am sorry" when you do not recognize your fault. If you do, then you are jumping out of the frying pan into the fire because it is very important to indicate what you did wrong and know what makes the person feel upset. Apologizing just to try to gain the victim's favor is not an efficient way. In addition, when you apologize, do not use any communication devices. The victim would think that the offender considers the apology as an annoying work. When people apologize in person, it would be easy to express one's truthful emotion. But, if you cannot apologize in person, writing a letter would more likely move the victim's mind and give forgiveness to you than depending on text messages. A sincere apology can be enacted by a brave person who can face one's mistakes truthfully.

The next step of a sincere apology is to acknowledge responsibility for one's faults. After recognizing your faults, you need to explain yourself and take a full responsibility. When you apologize, do not use a conditional word, "if," because this word destroys a perfect apology. When you say something like, "I am sorry if I hurt you," you are making a fauxpology. The word "if," has connotation of one's idea that the victim is ungenerous or they pay too much attention to a small thing. Furthermore, do not include any reason as an excuse to defend yourself and to convince a victim. You are not the person who judges the mistake and they do not care whether you have an excuse or not. It is a fact that you already damaged them and what you just need to do is take a sincere responsibility and say, "I am sorry that I hurt you."

In the middle of an apology, showing regret leads a victim to a positive response. Now you need to express how you feel about what you did wrong. For example, you can say, "I regret that I hurt your feelings," or "I feel terrible about that." These statements can convey how you feel regretful for the victim and the victim is more likely to accept the apology. Also, we can see how powerful expressing regret is in a court. When the offender shows his regret, a judge might shorten the imprisonment time length. Moreover, the timing is a key to make an effective apology. You'd better express your true regret to the victim as soon as the incident happened. While the victim is trembling with rage, however, it is better to delay the apology until the anger abates because it does not seem that you think about your fault deeply when you apologize immediately after the incident.

Offering restitution also has a significant effect on a process of apology. Simply speaking, restitution is an action to restore one's loss, damage, or injury. For instance, when you lose someone else's bike unintentionally, you could restitute the lost bike by monetary compensation. However, these actions would not fulfill a sincere apology if a person approaches it with a doubtful manner. It is not a simple process because the aspiration of doing this is to free the victim from the physical or psychological damage and redeem yourself from the fault you committed. It is also critical that the restitution should to be done after conceding your fault and showing your regret. If the restitution is improperly done before the previous steps, the victim would not accredit your intention to apologize genuinely and consider you as a coward who attempts to escape from your responsibility.

The last step of an effective apology is to promise that you will not commit the same mistake ever again. In this step, as a result of promising it, you would get closer to receive forgiveness from the victim. Even though promising that it would not happen again and asking forgiveness have an idealistic role to complete a perfect apology, many people do not include this step in a process of apology. In addition, it can be more elusive for elderly people to ask forgiveness because they have a high self-esteem that hinders them from confessing their faults. A statement like "Please forgive me. I won't do it again" would help both victim and the offender re-develop a relationship while diminishing feelings of hatred and guilt. We can say that these actions can be a final destination of the excursion of a sincere apology.

Until now, we have reviewed the five steps that are necessary for making an appropriate apology. The apology "I am sorry," cannot be a real apology if we do not follow the five steps successfully. These are: showing recognition, accepting responsibility, offering remorse, offering restitution, and promising. We all do make mistakes and apologizing is not simple to do. Maybe a perfect apology never exists. However, it does not mean that we cannot be a good person because we all have rights to apologize for our faults. All we need to know is that you will make a sincere apology only when you are ready to face your fault thoroughly. Apologizing truthfully makes you step beyond who you used to be. Sincerity should always follow an apology and they will never be separated from each other.

Is English the Best Language?

The *Summer Institute for Linguistics (SIL)* estimates a significant number of almost one billion of persons of the world speak Chinese. In contrast only 475 million persons in the world speak English. It might be true to say that English is the most internationally used language in the world. For example, English is used for international business. However, Chinese is also becoming more popular in the business world than English.

Another reason why English is not the best language is because it is a really hard language to learn. It has an incredibly complicated grammar and pronunciation. For example, English is harder to learn than Spanish. If we speak about some characteristics like the pronunciation, English has a lot of silent letters in many words. Spanish only has one silent letter, the 'h' as the words "ahora" where the letter "h" is silent and its pronunciation is "aora". However, English has silent letters such as the second "e" in the word "interesting", and the u in "double." The English language also has another difficulty in pronunciation. It isn't spoken the same as the way that you write it. For example, in Spanish the letters only have one sound; however, in English one letter can vary in the pronunciation depending on the word.

Another example is that English has a significant number of phonetic vowels. While Spanish has 5 pure vowels and 5 diphthongs, English has 12 pure vowels sounds and 8 diphthongs (Coe, 1987). As a result, is really difficult for people who learn English because they have to memorize more sounds and the different uses of each one. Spanish has a strong relationship with the sound of the word and its spelling. For example, written Spanish only has 3 double letters such as "LL" "RR" "CC. In contrast, English has 5 times as many. This causes Spanish speakers to reduce double letters to only one, or overcompensate by doubling a letter unnecessary when they are learning English.

In conclusion, all these contrasts explain why the belief that English is the best language in the world is wrong. English is not the most widely spoken language in the world, and English is very difficult to learn. As a clever man once said, "Making English grammar conforms to Latin rules is like asking people to play baseball using the rules of football".

how this could have happened even the police. Some people are protesting so that this event be investigated thoroughly. My purpose is that New York Times shows this information and makes it known because this case looks like a racist murder and the police haven't taken impartial decisions in the case.

To begin, I'm going to explain what "supposedly" happened. Trayvon was watching a basketball game in his house with his father when he decided to go to a convenient store. After he bought some snacks and a drink, he was walking back to his home. They asked for what reason was the boy killed? According to Michael J.
