Notes from the Office

We want all of you to feel as comfortable as possible while you are studying with us here at the ELI. If you have any questions, your teachers, your Language Assistants, our staff members or administrators are here to help you, so please ask us anything.

For specific questions about I-20s and other immigration matters, or university or community college admissions, please email or call **Daryl Bish**, our Assistant Director.

For personal problems, questions about insurance and immunization, or apartment concerns, email or call **Victoria Dolce**, the Student Life Coordinator.

Deadlines: The deadline to drop or add a class, pay tuition, submit proof of insurance and immunizations, and turn in financial guarantees, is Wednesday, July 1. **If you miss any of these deadlines**, **email Jennifer Vann or Victoria Dolce right away**, or you could be removed from classes or charged a late fee! Also, students who drop a class or withdraw from the ELI after the drop/add deadline on Wednesday, July 1 will not be able to receive a refund or credit for their courses and their transcript will have a grade of W (withdraw).

Independence Day: Remember that Friday, July 3rd is the Independence Day holiday. UF and the ELI will be closed, and there will be reduced RTS bus service, so be sure to plan accordingly.

Weather: Remember that Florida can sometimes get dangerous weather in the summer, such as heavy rains or hurricanes, so download an app like **Gatorsafe** to receive notifications about possible danger on UF campus or any other important information.

Attendance Policy

Class attendance is a requirement of the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) for students on the F-1 visa. It is also required by the ELI because we feel that you cannot learn English if you do not come to class regularly. To help you stay focused on your studies and to maintain your student status, the ELI has the following attendance policy:

- · If you miss more than 31 hours (25%) of absences, you can no longer attend ELI classes and your I-20 will be terminated.
- · If you miss more than 19 hours (15%) of classes, or fail any of your classes, you will not receive a semester certificate and you will be allowed to return to the English Language Institute the next semester <u>ONLY</u> on a probationary basis.
- If you miss five days in a row in all of your classes without informing the English Language Institute prior to or immediately after the five days, you can be expelled from the ELI.
