Q: I am ordering takeout a lot and I don't understand when I should tip. Can you explain when to tip during the pandemic?

Tipping in restaurants is particularly important here in the US; servers in restaurants in Florida have a minimum wage of only \$5.54 an hour, which is much less than the Florida minimum wage of \$8.56. But what are the new norms during the pandemic?

At restaurants with a carry-out option: In normal times, diners are not obligated to tip for carryout, but now, when many restaurants are under pandemic restrictions, experts suggest a tip of 15-20% when you go to a restaurant to pick up and take home your food. This does not include fast food restaurants like McDonalds that have a pickup window in normal times.

<u>Grocery delivery and meal delivery:</u> Delivery services like Instacart and Doordash should also be tipped. Experts suggest 10-20% for grocery delivery and 15% for meal delivery.

These 'rules' change with the changing times, so ask if you have any questions.
