Are you feeling bored and hungry? Try this simple, tasty, and cheap recipe. There are no meat products at all, so everyone can enjoy it. All you need is: 1 medium zucchini, 5 tablespoons (TBS) all-purpose flour, 3 TBS cornstarch, 5 TBS water, vegetable oil for frying, and 1 TBS soy sauce, 1 teaspoon (tsp) vinegar, I TBS water, ¹/₂ tsp sugar, a pinch

of black pepper, a pinch of red chili pepper flakes for dipping sauce. Cut the zucchini into slices and mix the flour, cornstarch, and water in a bowl. Dip and coat the zucchini slices into the batter and then cook them in a heated skillet with two TBS of oil over medium heat until golden brown. Mix the dipping sauce ingredients to dip your cooked slices while eating them. Many people love this recipe. I hope you try and enjoy this favorite among Korean recipes!
