Today, many museums around the world contain art and artifacts that were stolen from their countries of origin during colonial rule or looted during war. Museums play an essential role in preserving local culture and history. With heedful documentation and artifact preservation, a culture can be recorded and remembered in spite of that future. In this essay I will try to detail below the reasons why museums should not return artifacts that were taken from other countries during times of conquest or occupation.

The worst effect and the one because people don't drink a lot of energy boosters is the addictive of the caffeine, "Roland Griffiths, a professor of behavioral biology at Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine, says the amount of caffeine necessary to produce dependency and withdrawal symptoms is about 100 milligrams a day." (Warner,

Artifacts are hidden all around the world; they were left by pharaohs, kings, cities or valorous people. These objects have an enormous price in the market which can lead into many problems such as, sells in the black market, thieves, damaging places or the object or even conflicts between countries which is going to be discussed in this essay. To evaluate if a country should give or return the artifact to another there are many factors, but this essay will focus on three of these, the safety of the artifact, the risk of moving it between countries and the benefits of having the artifact in a country. According to Kirsty Rice in a text published in 2015 "The collection of antiquities done properly to further the education and appreciation of an artifact is a beautiful thing; artifacts should be able to be shared and should be displayed for people to see. However, I do not support when the removal of an antiquity is detrimental to the integrity of the piece." The knowledge of this let us infer that there is no unique answer to this question, and the possible answer would be that every case is different and should have different answers.

The most important thing to do with an artifact according to Rice is to maintain its safety, because it is valuable and contains information about the past. Some countries like Egypt that lack funding and support are known to have a high demand on the black market and low security for their museum. This means they are more likely to suffer from thieves and issues than countries like United Kingdom who invest much more money in high security museums, infrastructure and research of artifacts. So as a researcher the artifact should always be maintained in the safest country.

Following the last paragraph to keep safe the object, sometimes we have to move it long distances, but moving such an object is very difficult and delicate, is an arguable action to do and a risk to take. Due to the care, the problems in the transportation vehicles or the vulnerability of the object moving it between countries is highly dangerous and something that depending on how beneficial is to the artifact then think about taking the risk. The idea is to keep the best treatment possible even in the transportation because they are objects of study and educational antiquities.

Having an antiquity in a country means many benefits, because artifacts give information, education and persuade foreign people to visit which helps with the economy. Morally speaking, this benefit should be given to the country where the artifact was found, and most of the times that is not the case. "Many artifacts removed from their country of origin were not freely given; artifacts were frequently taken through colonialism, conquest, or theft. Today, hundreds of museum pieces are the product of thieves taking advantage of situations in the past. Theft remains a common occurrence on even famous and wellattended archaeological digs—to say nothing of grave-robbing and treasure-hunting." (Steenburgh, 2018) This situation aside the safety of the object, is not morally correct and a good point for those who agree with keeping them in their origin countries.

In conclusion, there are many factors that determine the case, and giving a definite answer is something very difficult. What is known is that independently of every case it must always be first the safety of the object. However, there are moral thoughts that should be evaluated before deciding what to do. This problem affects many countries in the world and creates many conflicts. The two sides have very strong arguments, but with that in mind I will always endorse that the main priority is that the artifact has to be kept safe.

Kimberly Brubaker Bradley's book, The War That Saved My Life (New York: Puffin Books, 2016) is about a story of Ada, a 11- year-old girl with a disability, and Jamie, her younger brother, during World War II. They live in London and their mother was abusive to them. Ada has a club foot and due to that, her mom never lets her go out of their house in her life. After her mother goes to work and Jamie goes to school, looking out of the window is the only thing that Ada can do. She cannot read and write. Even though she is 11 years old, she is not educated. One day, Jamie told Ada and his mother that his teacher said all children had to leave London because of the war, and when Ada asked her mom what she should do, her mom said that Ada would not go anywhere and be stuck in this house. However, Ada and Jamie evacuate from London to the countryside at the break of day when their mom is sleeping. In that place, they meet Susan, their new guardian, and for the first time they feel loved and cherished. In other words, they find their new lives there. This book broke my heart at the beginning because the way their mom treated the children was unbelievably harsh, but fortunately, since they met Susan, the story became beautiful. Looking at Ada's change through Susan, I realized that accepting love and being taught is really important to all humans, especially children.

Every child deserves to be loved. Nevertheless, Ada never thinks she deserves love. When I read this book, the thoughts that Ada is thinking about herself are miserable. Her mom always tells her that her club food is her fault and she is ashamed of Ada because Ada is a disabled person. Ada's mom does not even let Ada use the toilet in the house, so she has to use a pot in her room. This is terrible and extremely abusive to her, so reading this part was really hard for me. At this moment, I doubted this book is truly good for children. However, after Ada meets Susan and receives love from her, Ada starts realizing what love is. Because of her abusive mom, accepting Susan's love takes forever for Ada. Ada always doubts why Susan is so kind to her and thinks that Susan will leave her someday. This broke my heart. Healing a wounded heart takes a long time, so we need to take care of children more.

I confirmed again education is crucially important for children. Ada is 11 years old but she cannot read and write, so Susan teaches her how to read and write. Finally, Ada became

able to write her name for the first time. Also, Susan keeps telling Ada that having a club foot is not her fault and it can be fixed. For real, Susan takes her to the doctor so that the club foot is fixed. As Susan's trying to build the relationship with Ada, she starts to think that the club foot is not her fault, and she deserves better. When Ada had to come back to London, her mom treats her as usual, but Ada does not tolerate her mom's treatment like she used to. For the first time, Ada asks her mom why her mom never tried to fix her foot. If she had not met Susan, confronting her mom would have been impossible. Before she met Susan, she did not know how to express her thoughts and could not think the way she was being treated by her mom was not appropriate. This is why I think education is vital for children to form their perspective toward their lives.

The war didn't save only two kids' lives. It saved Susan's life as well. When Ada and Jamie arrived at Susan's house, she was living alone. She was depressed after losing her best friend who used to live with her. She did not know the purpose of her life, so when a government official asked her to accept the two kids, she did not want to, but she had to. Building the new relationship between them was a complicated adventure. At the beginning, Susan was not pleased to live with the kids, but she was a nice person, so she tried her best to treat them like her children. As time went by, Susan has sincerely loved them, and when they had to return to London, she was deeply sad. On the other hand, since Ada and Jamie experienced the love from Susan, living with their mom was hard to stand for them. Eventually, they escaped from their mom again, and Susan also left for London to meet them. They met each other in London together, and Susan realized again how she loves them so much. When they came back to Susan's house, her house had been destroyed in a bombing. If she had not left for London, she would have died. Susan said, "The two of you saved my life, you did." Ada said, "So now we're even." This conversation is the last part of the book and strongly touching. Love is so powerful. Not only being loved but also giving love is meaningful and motivates people to live positively.

This book is my first book that I read in the U.S. What if Ada had not met Susan, and what if Ada lived with her mom forever? When I asked this question to myself, I shook my head. Looking at Ada's change, I became aware how love affects and changes people. I highly recommend this book to those who want to read deeply touching story.

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
