Q: What is the difference between less *and* fewer?

A: Use *fewer* if you're referring to people or things in the plural (e.g. houses, newspapers, dogs, students, children).

• People these days are buying **fewer newspapers**.

Use *kss* when you're referring to something that can't be counted or doesn't have a plural (e.g. money, air, time, music, rain).

• It's a better job but they pay you **less money**.

Less is also used with numbers when they are on their own and with expressions of measurement or time.

• Their marriage lasted **less** than two **years**.
