The performers wear Hanbok, which is the national costume of Korea, and special hats with ribbons. They normally play percussion instruments like a drum and Kkwaenggwari, which is made of iron. Also, performers dance to the exciting rhythm. Furthermore, they do an acrobatic movement, so I wonder what they can't do.

You can see traditional performances in many cities in Korea. Most of them are free or very cheap, but the performances are priceless.
