

A: The rule for prepositions of time for dates is the following:

Use **in** + month, year, century, or season.

• I was born in March, in the twentieth century, in spring

Use **on** + date, weekday, weekday morning, afternoon, evening.

- I was born **on** October 30.
- I was born **on** Wednesday morning.

Use **at** + noon, night, clock time, present.

- I was born at 10 p.m.
- I was not born **at** night.
