This week's country is Mali.





Capital: Bamako Population:  $\leq 22,500,000$ 

**Fun Fact:** Many people think that **Mansa Moussa**, a Malian Emperor in the 1400s, was the richest person who ever lived. According to some researchers, his personal net worth was about \$400 billion, which is almost twice as much as the current richest man in the world.

Three things to know:

- 1. Mali has 13 official languages; *Bambara* is the most famous, and it is spoken by more than 50% of the population. The new constitution dropped French as an official language in 2023, but it remains the working language.
- Around 94% of the Malian population are Muslim.

3. Mali is the world's hottest country. The average annual temperature is approximately 29 degrees Celsius.

A: Yes. The US federal government passed the Safe Drinking Water Act in 1974. This act makes sure that the water that comes out of the tap, including the faucets in your apartments, is safe to drink.
