UF Campus Landmarks: Century Tower

One interesting landmark on the University of Florida campus is Century Tower. The tower was built in 1956 and is 157 feet tall. The top of the tower is the home of a carillon, or a set of bells. The UF carillon has 61 bells that are played with a keyboard with 61 keys and 25 foot pedals. You can hear the bells ring every fifteen minutes. Also, every day at 12:35pm and 4:55pm, you can hear a 20-minute concert by a carillonneur, or a person who plays the carillon. The carillonneurs are all students at the University of Florida. If you haven't already, visit Century Tower and listen to an amazing carillon concert!

Q: Is it ok to drink the tap water in my apartment?

A: Yes, the water in Gainesville is safe to drink and complies with state and federal rules for drinking water quality. The water is considered to be "hard," which means there are dissolved minerals in the water. Some people do not like the taste of the water. It is probably cheaper to buy a water purifier than it is to buy drinking water at Publix to correct this problem.

Q: How do I make the bus stop when I need to get off?

A: The buses in Gainesville have either a button/bar to push, or a wire to pull to signal to the driver that you want to get off the bus.
