A: It depends on what you are trying to express with the full sentence. If you are answering this question:

Where are you studying?

Then you can say:

• I am studying **at** the University of Florida.

If you are answering this question:

What are you studying?

You can say:

- I am majoring **in** engineering.
- I am studying engineering.

You can combine ideas like this:

- I am majoring **in** engineering **at** the University of Florida.
- I am studying engineering **at** the University of Florida

Here are some other examples:

- He is a professor **in** the Physics Department **at** Harvard University.
- I am a PhD student in Business at MIT.
